The Mohawk Council of Akwesasne and the Saint Regis Mohawk Tribe are excited to announce an innovation of a youth leadership group who will travel to Kirikiriroa (Hamilton), New Zealand from September 14 - 23, 2026 the 2026 World Indigenous Suicide Prevention Conference (WISPC) and Cultural exchange. We are searching for youth who are interested in taking a journey towards health and wellness, as we prepare to travel across the world to embark on a journey of self-discovery and awareness. This beneficial opportunity will be an expense paid trip for successful candidates who are ready to explore through culture, learning and growth. If you are a devoted youth who is seeking new and fulfilling experiences, then this opportunity is for you.

The WISPC is a global event to bring Indigenous Nations together to share cultural-based approaches of addressing suicide in our communities across Turtle Island and sister nations across the world. During this conference, there is a sharing of methodologies, stories, knowledge, and practices across various communities. From this conference, we hope to share the efforts toward suicide prevention in Indigenous communities with our youth to encourage values of leadership for the future generations.

Leading up to this initiative, the youth will participate in building character, leadership skills, and life-skills. They will also gain traditional knowledge by interacting with cultural knowledge holders within the community. Our goal is to build confidence within the youth's self-identity and prepare them to represent Akwesasne in a good way.

Who can apply for this opportunity?

Any Akwesasronon youth who is between the ages 15-24 and is a registered member with the Mohawk Council of Akwesasne or the Saint Regis Mohawk Tribe. The applicant must have a valid passport or be willing and able to obtain one. The applicant must be comfortable with the long-distance travel as well as absence from home for a brief period of time. The applicant must be committed and eager to participate in a program that is designed to prepare youth to travel and represent at the 2026 World Indigenous Suicide Prevention Conference and cultural exchange.
